# **Best Practice Resource: Your College or University**

Most universities and colleges have updated their landing pages with special links to COVID-19 resources and support. Use this friendly guide when navigating:

- >>Need information about commencement or graduation? Often colleges will link to FAQs on graduation, commencement, etc. These are updating in real time.
- >>Need counseling support services? Many colleges and universities are allowing students to schedule appointments with the counseling or well-being centers. Check with your campus to see if this is available to you.
- >>Need information regarding storage of materials? Reach out to Student Life or Residence Life for more information. Many colleges have options for free storage for students.
- >>Want to know about transportation reimbursement? Some colleges are offering this support as well, be sure to check with Financial Aid to see if this applies.
