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1.BACKGROUND INFORMATION

IDEA Public Schools ("IDEA") is a Texas nonprofit corporation and a tax-exempt organization pursuant to the Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Pursuant to Chapter 12, Subchapter D of the Texas Education Code and its Contract for Charter with the Texas State Board of Education, as renewed by the Commissioner of Education, IDEA is an open-enrollment charter holder, governmental entity and public school system. IDEA prepares Texas students from underserved communities for success in college and citizenship. IDEA is a growing network of 123 high-performing charter schools serving approximately 67,988 students located throughout Texas in the Austin, El Paso, Houston, Permian Basin, Rio Grande Valley, San Antonio, and Tarrant County regions. Although IDEA's growth is rapid, it is also carefully planned. Schools begin with select grade levels and eventually reach full scale as a Pre-K-12 campus as grade levels are added to accommodate the students' advancement.

IDEA's mission is College for All. IDEA serves primarily low-income students in underserved areas of both rural and urban communities. Over 80% of IDEA students are considered low-income and one of every three students is the first in their family to go to college. Since the first graduating class in 2007, 100% of seniors have been accepted and matriculated to a college or university every year for fourteen consecutive years. Thanks to a rigorous path to college that begins in Pre-K, IDEA students attend selective universities throughout the country, win national awards and scholarships, and complete college at a rate six times the national average for low-income students.

2.GENERAL INTENT

IDEA is soliciting an Invitation for Bids (IFB) for **maintenance of IDEA UIL soccer fields** for four (4) IDEA Florida campuses identified in "Attachment L".

Each vendor shall furnish the information required in the bid package. The vendor shall **sign first page of this bid and all addenda(s) (if issued)**. The person signing the proposal **must initial** at the bottom of every page, erasures, and/or other changes. Bids signed by an agent must be accompanied by evidence of the agent's authority unless such evidence has been previously furnished to IDEA. The result of this IFB solicitation is a **one (1) year term** upon board approval with the option to extend **two (2) additional one (1) year terms**.

- a. Deliveries shall be Freight on board (FOB) Destination to IDEA destination sites. Freight prepaid and assumed by the vendor. IDEA reserves the right to pick up items in lieu of delivery from local vendors.
- b. IDEA does not pay Federal Excise Taxes. Tax exemption certificates will be provided upon request.
- c. The vendor may offer an "equal" product or product exceeding specifications as an alternate proposal. Final determination of whether an item is an "approved equal" remains with IDEA.
- d. Bids submitted on forms other than the IDEA forms or with different terms or provisions may be considered as non-responsive proposals.
- e. All bids shall remain firm for a term of 120 days after IFB solicitation period is closed.
- f. The vendor shall certify that no federal or state suspension or debarment is in place, which would preclude receiving a state or federally funded award.

3.RESERVATIONS

IDEA expressly reserves the right to:

- a. Waive minor deviations from the specifications when it is determined that the total cost to the IDEA of the deviating proposal is lower than the lowest conforming proposal which meets all aspects of the specifications, and the overall function of the goods or services, or both, specified in the deviating proposal is equal to or greater than that of the conforming proposal.



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- b. Waive any defect, irregularity, or informality in any proposal procedure.
- c. Reject any or all proposals.
- d. Amend a proposal prior to proposal opening date to extend or make changes to specification.
- e. Procure any item by other means.
- f. Increase or decrease the quantity specified in the proposal unless the offeror specifies otherwise.

5.NOTICE TO ALL VENDORS

- a. Vendor shall keep IDEA advised of any changes in order(s) status.
- b. All submittals are to be for **maintenance of IDEA UIL soccer fields** as indicated in the bid item list located on **Attachment L** of this IFB. Pricing should include freight/shipping costs and any other fees that apply as indicated by IDEA.



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- c. IDEA encourages HUB vendor participation, if vendor is a state certified HUB vendor (Historically Underutilized Business) and/ or certified MWBD vendor (Minority and Women-owned Business), certification must be included in submittal.
- d. All pricing and any award under this IFB shall be available for all IDEA departments and divisions and any other entity purchasing through IDEA.
- e. The selected respondent(s) will follow practices, processes, and protocols established by local, state, and federal agencies with respect to their field of service and goods.
- f. All bids will be screened for inclusion of all required information prior to release to the evaluation team. IDEA staff may exclude from further consideration for contract award any non-responsive proposal or portion of a proposal.

6. QUALIFICATIONS & EQUIPMENT

IDEA expectations with respect to the performance by each vendor in connection with the purchases are set out in the "Contract Documents" which consist of the Invitation for Bids ("IFB"), Instructions to Vendors, Standard Terms and Conditions, and Bid Sheet. Vendors who fail to examine the Contract Documents do so at their own risk.

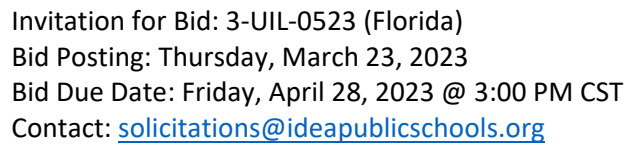
- A. The bid item list and specifications that follow are specific requirements. Any deviation or comparable product must be properly identified and be accepted by IDEA Public Schools through individual submittals of **Attachment "K"** included in this IFB packet, one for each deviation. Any deviation to specifications must be listed and clearly defined.
- B. Scope of work including equipment specifications will be listed in **Attachment "L"**. For this reason, vendors are discouraged from describing any deviations simply as "equal" or "exceeds" the defined requirements: Instead, vendors are strongly encouraged to explain all deviations in the template provided. Failure to do so may result in the rejection of the bid and or product for non-compliance.

1. Qualifications

- a. All bidders must have a principal person with a Major or equivalent experience in Horticulture or Turfgrass Science. **Resumes must be provided.**
- b. The business must have a lead position to direct the work crews. The principal or lead person must have a minimum education of 2-year associates in turfgrass with a 3 or more years' experience directing and maintaining an Athletic turfgrass maintenance operation.
- c. Acceptable experience would be equivalent to Superintendent of turfgrass at a golf course or on athletic fields.
- d. This person or persons must have references.
- e. Bidders/companies are preferred to have experience at schools on soccer, baseball, or football fields.
- f. Please include references for the bidding company.
- g. The principal or the lead person must be licensed and able to perform all fertilizer & IPM chemical concentration/application calculations and be able to manage the complete program. They must be able to identify the pests, weeds and fungus for our region that are associated with the athletic fields.
- h. The Principal or lead must be documented at the site at least once per week and the Lead person must have real time knowledge of the crew activities.

2. Equipment

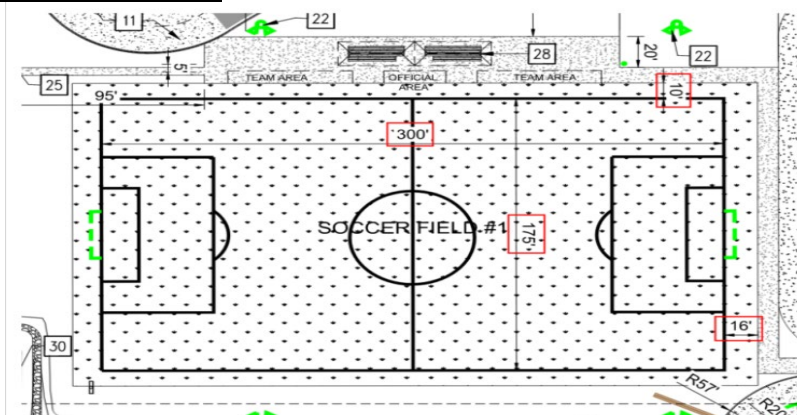
- a. All mowing equipment must be in good condition. **Please include pictures.**
- b. The following is an equipment list of the minimum equipment required:
 - i. Quantity of two (2) John Deere Model 2653B Precision Cut Trim and Surrounds Reel Mowers or **equivalent**. All mowers will be Diesel powered Reel Mowers. Need to have a minimum of two (2) mowers described above. **Rotary mowers are not acceptable.**



- ## **6.SCOPE OF WORK**

IDEA Public Schools in Florida is looking for a qualified vendor to provide **UIL Soccer Field Maintenance** for the following Florida regions: Tampa Bay & Jacksonville. Campus name and address can be found in **Attachment L**. This bid will be based on the price per field and awarded by region.

Key dimensions are highlighted





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Each field is approximately 1.5 acres (65,340 square feet). If a field is more than 1.5 acres and if it is agreed to by IDEA, the price can be adjusted with a price per sq. ft multiplier. Bidders must submit the price per field and price per sq. ft.

The selected vendor shall provide the following services but not limited to:

A. Mowing of UIL Fields

- All UIL fields will be mowed once per week with the reel type mower specified in the Equipment section.

B. Take Soil Samples

- Vendor shall take soil samples from each field. The fertilization program will be partially based on this fertilization. It will also be based on the grass needs and activities required by the school. For example, a liquid fertilizer application may be requested to prepare for a School event or additional fertilizer may be required to prepare the grass for the playing season.

C. Fertilization of Fields

- Fertilization shall be performed at least 10x per year. Each event will have at least 1 lb. of N or more per 1000 sq. ft.
- Fertilizer shall also have appropriate amounts of P, K and other elements based on the soil samples and the needs of the plants.

***Please attach a strategy on this in the bid package.**

- The above listed fertilizer spreader (Lely or Vicon type fertilizer spreader) or sprayer (John Deere 2030A 300- or 200-gallon mechanical broadcast boom sprayer on a diesel utility vehicle) will be used to apply the fertilizer to ensure even application. (See Section 6.2 Equipment)

D. Weed Control

- Weed control shall be maintained at a high level of expectation. No weeds should grow to a flowering or seed production phase.
- To prevent the establishment of weeds, four (4) pre-emergent type herbicide applications shall be scheduled and applied strategically. **Please provide a proposed schedule.**
- Vendor shall use follow up selective herbicides to reduce and minimize populations.
- Vendor shall monitor very difficult weeds to include but not limited to weeds in the Nutsedge family or Goose Grass family. Vendor shall keep populations shall under control.

E. Water Management Program

- As part of the water management program, irrigation times shall be adjusted and malfunctioned spray heads and equipment shall be identified. Bidder must have the ability to coordinate with coaches and administration, develop a wetting agent program to conserve water, and possess good working knowledge of the irrigation system and equipment used on IDEA campuses.
- **The entire field will be top dressed with a mixture of 80% sand and 20% organic matter annually. Equipment listed above in Section 2: Equipment will be used to obtain an even application. The applicator or successful bidder will ensure the sand is evenly applied. This is to ensure the ball rolls smoothly.**
- All fields will be aerified and verti-cut at least once per year. The above listed equipment shall be used.

F. Overseeding Schedule

- **Please provide a plan for overseeding schedule** to include a 3-way perennial Ryegrass at 15-20 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft.



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- The edges shall be finished with a drop spreader and a rotary type spreader will be used for the remainder of the field. A hydroseeder may be used at the same rate of 15-20 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft.

***Quality shall be measured with a semi-annual assessment form that will be submitted to the school representative. The grass should be growing on 90% of the field that did not require renovation or has been renovated. It should have a satisfactory green color.**

8.WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO RESPOND

6. Electronic format on a USB flash drive. The electronic version shall be one file that replicates your original proposal including required signatures. NOTE: Do not send individual files of each section or page of your proposal as the electronic version.

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ATTACHMENT "C"

CERTIFICATION REGARDING WORK HOURS AND SAFETY STANDARDS

Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 3701-3708). Where applicable, all contracts awarded by the non-Federal entity in excess of \$100,000 that involve the employment of mechanics or laborers must include a provision for compliance with 40 U.S.C. 3702 and 3704, as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5). Under 40 U.S.C. 3702 of the Act, each contractor must be required to compute the wages of every mechanic and laborer on the basis of a standard work week of 40 hours. Work in excess of the standard work week is permissible provided that the worker is compensated at a rate of not less than one and a half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of 40 hours in the work week. The requirements of 40 U.S.C. 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous. These requirements do not apply to the purchases of supplies or materials or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence.

The undersigned subcontractor certifies it will comply with the contract work hours and safety standards act:

- No contractor or subcontractor contracting for any part of the contract work which may require or involve the employment of laborers or mechanics shall require or permit any such laborer or mechanic in any workweek in which he or she is employed on such work to work in excess of forty hours in such workweek unless such laborer or mechanic receives compensation at a rate not less than one and one-half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours in such workweek.
- In the event of any violation of the clause set forth in first paragraph of this section the contractor and any subcontractor responsible therefor shall be liable for the unpaid wages. In addition, such contractor and subcontractor shall be liable to the United States Department of Labor for liquidated damages. Such liquidated damages shall be computed with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, employed in violation of the clause set forth in first paragraph of this section, in the sum of \$27 for each calendar day on which such individual was required or permitted to work in excess of the standard workweek of forty hours without payment of the overtime wages required by the clause set forth in first paragraph of this section.
- The United States Department of Agriculture shall upon its own action or upon written request of an authorized representative of the Department of Labor withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the contractor or subcontractor under any such contract or any other Federal contract with the same prime contractor, or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime contractor, such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such contractor or subcontractor for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (2) of this section.



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- The contractor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in previous paragraphs of this section and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime contractor shall be responsible for compliance by any subcontractor or lower tier subcontractor with the clauses set forth in previous paragraphs of this section.

CERTIFICATION REGARDING DAVIS-BACON ACT

Davis-Bacon Act, as amended (40 U.S.C. 3141-3148). 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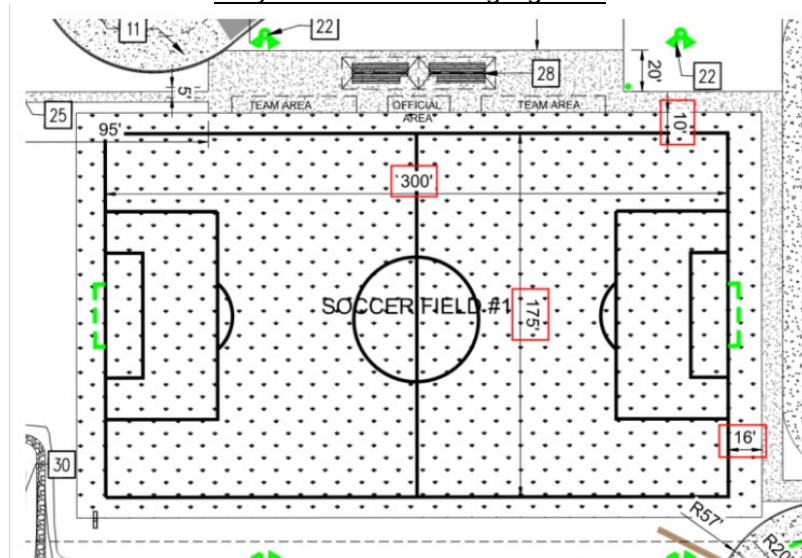

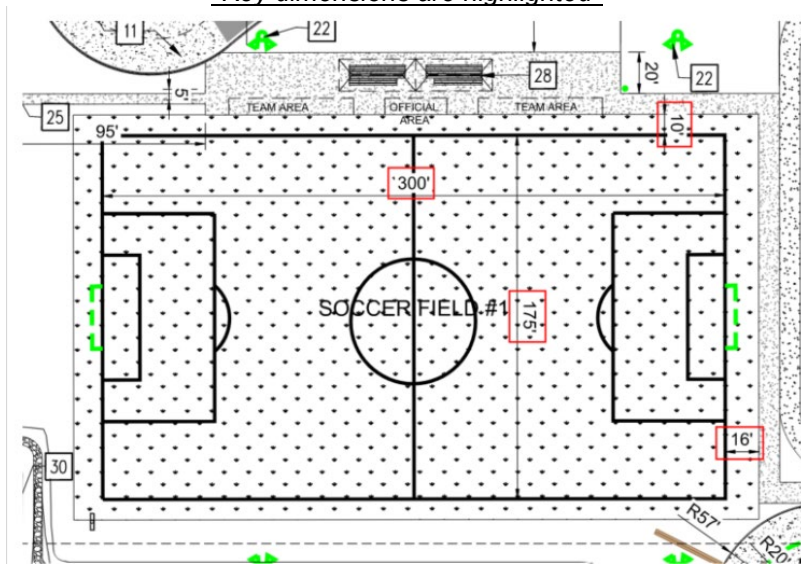

TERMS & CONDITIONS FOR CONTRACTS PAID WITH FEDERAL FUNDS

Instruction to bidder: With respect to the use of federal funds for the procurement of goods and services, pursuant to § 200.326 of Title 2 to the Code of Federal Regulations ("2 CFR") and Appendix II to 2 CFR 200, the following contract provisions are hereby made a part of this IFB and the resulting contract between IDEA Public Schools ("School") and Bidder. The Act provides that each contractor or subrecipient must be prohibited from inducing, by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he or she is otherwise entitled. The school and the charter districts must report all suspected or reported violations to the Federal awarding agency.
5. Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act. Where applicable, all contracts awarded by the school and the charter districts in excess of \$100,000 that involve the employment of mechanics or laborers must include a provision for compliance with 40 U.S.C. 3702 and 3704, as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR 5).
