This past year, IDEA welcomed over 80,000 motivated and bright scholars and more than 11,000 staff members. Across Texas, IDEA operated 120 schools, welcomed over 68,000 motivated scholars, and more than 10,000 staff members.

IDEA Austin's Class of 2022 earned over 800 college acceptances with 50% of acceptances to the nation's most selective (Tier 1 or Tier 2) colleges and universities.

In addition, IDEA Montopolis senior Juan Sanchez became the first IDEA Austin recipient of the Judy and Al Lopez Scholar award in memory of IDEA's late Board Chair and Acting CEO.



EL PASO

IDEA El Paso led TEA's Education Service Center, Region 19's Reading and Math performance in Meets and Masters on the STAAR Exam. IDEA Mesa Hills College Prep ranked as one of the top five middle schools in the El Paso area from the nonprofit organization Children At Risk.



GREATER HOUSTON

IDEA Greater Houston continued to see strong results, particularly in student enrollment where the region was one of the only IDEA regions to achieve its enrollment targets for two years running.



Students were selected based on their academic achievement, financial gualifications, and personal character.

In 2021, the U.S. News & World Report ranked Elementary and Middle Schools across the nation for the first time. Out of over 70,000 elementary and middle schools, 43 of IDEA's schools were designated as "best in the nation". While IDEA's enrollment is roughly equivalent to the 10th largest school district in Texas, IDEA had more schools ranked than any other district in the state.

Dr. Cottrill comes to IDEA with experience as an after-school paraprofessional, teacher, assistant principal, principal, district superintendent and state official. He most recently spent five years as a senior leader at the Texas Education Agency (TEA). As TEA's Deputy Commissioner for Governance and Accountability, Dr. Cottrill was responsible for overseeing districts and charter schools in need of significant reform or improvement.

"Jeff is an education leader with tremendous gifts, heart and focus," said Collin Sewell, chair of the IDEA Board of Directors. "He is a veteran school administrator with valuable and diverse experience leading, overseeing, and improving school districts


