# 1. Purpose

The purpose of this Request for Information (RFI) is to gather information from qualified vendors regarding innovative, scalable, and data-driven assessment platforms that could support the needs of IDEA Public Schools beginning in the 2026–2027 school year.

This RFI is for planning and budgeting purposes only and does not constitute a solicitation or guarantee of a future contract award. Depending on the responses received, IDEA may pursue formal solicitation (RFP) or leverage existing cooperative contracts, if deemed appropriate.

#### 2. Background

IDEA Public Schools ("IDEA") is a Texas non-profit corporation and a tax-exempt organization pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Pursuant to Chapter 12, Subchapter D of the Texas Education Code and its Contract for Charter with the Texas State Board of Education, as renewed by the Commissioner of Education, IDEA is an open-enrollment charter holder, governmental entity, and public school system. IDEA transforms education by preparing graduates to succeed in college and life. IDEA is a growing network of high-performing charter schools serving students located throughout Texas in the Austin, El Paso, Houston, Permian Basin, Rio Grande Valley, San Antonio, and Tarrant County regions.



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IDEA serves primarily low-income students in underserved areas of both rural and urban communities. Over 80% of IDEA students are considered low-income and one of every three students is the first in their family to go to college. Since the first graduating class in 2007, nearly 100% of seniors have been accepted and matriculated to a college or university every year. Thanks to a rigorous path to college, IDEA students attend selective universities throughout the country, win national awards and scholarships, and complete college at a rate six times the national average for low-income students.

Note: While IDEA's program, curriculum, and mission have been replicated to serve students in other states, this Request for Proposals and any subsequent contract is only for goods and services provided to IDEA's Texas based charter school and campuses.

# 3. Objectives

IDEA seeks information about platforms that can:

- Provide customizable assessments (e.g., item banks, standards-based, or built from scratch)
- Support real-time analytics and data reporting
- Facilitate timely and performant exfiltration of data into our data warehousing platforms
- Integrate with Student Information System (SIS) and Learning Management System (LMS) platforms
- Offer multi-device student access
- Enable secure online and offline test delivery
- Accommodate all students equitably with built-in accessibility tools (e.g., language supports, screen readers, adjustable text sizing, etc.)
- Include educator tools for item creation, scoring, and intervention tracking
- Support Advanced Placement (AP) standards or allow custom standard imports (e.g. TEKS, Common Core, AP)
- Align with Texas state online testing experiences (visual layout, navigation, and flow)
