We need the support, assistance and cooperation of all IDEA Academy and College Prep Parents to adhere to the traffic flow and sign postings on campus. This is the only way we can provide the safest arrival and departure experience for you and your child. Be courteous to staff, other parents, and follow security guard instructions.

STUDENT DROP-OFF: Student campus drop-off is located at the front of each corresponding building. Doors open at 7:00am, and Staff will be on duty until 8:00 a.m. to assist you when you are dropping off your child. Students that get to school after 8:00 a.m. must report to the front office for a tardy slip and follow-up parent meetings will be arranged to address frequent tardy arrivals. Please DO NOT drop off your child in areas around the school after 8:00am, as all gates will be locked. Instead, drive into the front office to drop off if arrival is after 8:00am.

SCHOOL SAFETY / SECURITY: IDEA Edinburg has a Police Officer on site, who oversees our campus during the school day. All staff members are on duty during arrival and dismissal times, and our campus is locked as soon as instruction starts, and equipped with perimeter fencing, security gates/cameras. All visitors must report to the front office, ring the bell, and be granted access to drive into the front office parking lot to get assistance. A form of identification must be provided when visiting the school. In addition, our district prioritized our campus with the addition of perimeter fencing and security gates at each main entrance. In addition, our campus will benefit from the installation of security cameras around campus. Our campus executes several safety drills each month to make sure all staff/students are properly trained to respond to emergency situations.

PARENT EXPECTATIONS: We ask that on the first day of school, all parents remain in their vehicles. Due to safety precautions, parents will not be able to walk their child to the classroom. We are implementing safety measures to ensure your children are in a safe environment while maximizing instructional time. Our curriculum dictates very strict timelines for lessons. **Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.**

NO TEXTING IN SCHOOL ZONE: Student safety is our top priority. Please keep in mind that texting and driving in a school zone is prohibited by law and will be reported to local authorities.

BREAKFAST: Free breakfast is provided upon arrival, and students will need to scan their ID. Make sure your child arrives at school by 7:45 a.m. to have sufficient time for breakfast. Class starts at 8:00 a.m.

STUDENT PICK UP: Parents will be provided with a Student Pick-up Card to always be displayed when picking up your child. Students may be picked up in front of the building, and at the designated pick-up areas. Academy students with no College Prep siblings or siblings assigned to tutorials will be released at 3:15pm, and parents will need to drive into the school complex through Rogers Rd. to pick up your children. All other students will be released at 3:45pm. More communication will be published to simplify this process. Staff will be on duty during dismissal times to assist you when you are picking up your child. We ask that you wait for your child inside your car and have your child's name card displayed on your windshield. This process ensures that our students are safe and helps us execute an efficient dismissal.



LATE PICK-UP: If students are not picked up from school by 4:15 pm, we will be calling you or any listed emergency contacts for the student to be picked up.

PICKING UP STUDENTS BEFORE THE END OF THE DAY: Students will be required to attend a full school day. Therefore, early dismissal will only be allowed for emergencies and backed up by documentation. **No early dismissal will be allowed after 2:00pm.** Please try to schedule doctor's appointments after school to ensure your child does not miss out on instructional time. Our school day has been carefully planned so students learn every single minute of the day. Early pick-ups will be closely monitored and will follow up with parent meetings.

TRANSPORTATION/PICK-UP CHANGES: To ensure your child goes home via the correct dismissal method, and to make sure your child arrives home in a timely manner. All transportation changes will need to be made by 2:00 p.m. by calling the front desk. Academy: 956-287-6100. CP: 956-287-6300.

DAILY ATTENDANCE: Student success is largely dependent upon daily attendance; therefore, absent/tardy occurrences are taken very seriously. Teachers and school leaders will be making calls to parents to try and help bring students to school as soon as possible. We expect parents to cooperate and return phone calls and provide an explanation of the absence. Medical absences can only be excused with a doctor's note (national or international), and it is the parent's responsibility to ensure we receive this excuse **at the front office**. Please DO NOT send the doctor's excuses directly to the teachers or via text message. We will not be able to process medical excuses after a 10-day period and absences will stay on the student record as "unexcused." Parent meetings will be held if students accrue excessive unexcused absences.

TARDY ARRIVALS: Arrival after 8:00am is considered late. Repeated tardy arrivals are considered a Level I infraction as per the Student Code of Conduct. Repeated Level I infractions will lead to Level II or III infractions, which could ultimately result in expulsion if this behavior is not corrected. For late arrivals, parents will need to drive-in, park, and check-in students at the front office. If a student misses school for more than 10% of scheduled school days, he/she will be required to attend after school tutorials. Students will attend Saturday School and/or summer school to ensure any days that were missed throughout the school year are made up. There is a possibility of retention if students do not attend the extra recovery time given.

ADA (AVERAGE DAILY ATTENDANCE) CHALLENGE: Students will participate in different Perfect Attendance Challenges during the school year. Students who are in school every day (no excused or unexcused absences) and arrive before 8:00 a.m. will be eligible to receive prizes and attend special celebrations/trips.

UNIFORMS/ELECTRONICS: Full uniform is a DISTRICT requirement, and violations will not be accepted. Parents will be called and will be expected to bring students the correct uniform as soon as possible. All electronic devices (unless approved by the principal) should be turned off and completely stored out of sight during school hours. If students use any personal electronic device during school hours, devices will be confiscated and parents will be asked to pick up the devices from the front office. We are **NOT** responsible for any damaged or lost devices.

STUDENT TECHNOLOGY POLICY: Our school district's technology policy allows every student to have access to an electronic device for school related work. Students must use school-issued devices to access our systems; therefore, every parent has signed the Student Technology Policy during the Registration Process. Devices will be made available for students during class time for grades K-8th, and 9th-12th grades will be able to check out their device to use as needed during the duration of the school year. Parents are responsible for any device loss or vandalism, as stipulated in the signed contract.

LUNCH FROM HOME & STORE-BOUGHT FAST FOOD: IDEA Child Nutrition Program carefully plans free daily menus and includes the correct food portions for every child. If parents decide to send lunch from home, students must bring it with them in the morning and store it in their lunch box. We will not allow fast food deliveries to the front office. Once the school day begins, our staff will not deliver lunch from home to



classrooms or the cafeteria. If your child requires a special diet prescribed by a physician, please contact the Cafeteria Manager, Laura Moreno, by calling the front office.

BACKPACKS: For Academy lower grade levels, we discourage the use of large backpacks and recommend a backpack that your child is comfortable with since they will be carrying them throughout the day. Clear or mesh backpacks are optional. Backpacks with wheels will not be allowed.

HOMEROOM TEACHER/COMMUNICATION: Your child’s homeroom teacher will be your main source of contact and information for everyday issues. Attending “*Meet the Teacher Night*” will be crucial to establishing open communication with your child’s homeroom teacher. During this time, you will obtain his/her e-mail address & REMIND code. We will send separate communication for this event, which will take place on Tuesday, July 28, 2026, for Kinder, and August 5, 2026, for grades 1st -12th. An invitation with all the details will be sent to you to attend the mandatory Meet the Teacher Event.

MEDICATIONS/ACTION PLANS: Medications will only be administered by the school nurse. Parents must hand deliver any medications labeled with your child’s name including a “Medication Consent Form”. It is very important for parents to share with us specific action plans for certain medical conditions. Please reach out to our School Nurse (Shannon Lopez / Cristy Garza) for further inquiries.

ACCESS TO BOYS & GIRLS CLUB: All IDEA students have free access to the B&G after school program, which runs from 4pm-7pm. Students must follow B&G’s code of conduct, and any repeated/severe infractions will lead to expulsion from the after-school program.

IDEA EDINBURG AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM: IDEA Edinburg will offer parents the opportunity to sign their children up for several afterschool activities such as Cheer, Folklorico, Lego, Sports, Art, etc. Space in these clubs is limited, and spots will be filled on a first-come-first served basis. EDINBURG ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL: For the safety of all students and staff, we have designed the following Traffic Flow Plan. Given there are space limitations at the Edinburg Campus, which are outside our control, the following Flow Plan will help ensure students are dropped-off and picked-up safely. Please adhere to this Traffic Flow Plan and avoid parking in FIRE LANE areas or going around safety cones. Follow instructions given by our security personnel who will be guiding traffic. Repeat offenders will be reported to local authorities.
