

See It. Hear It. Report It.



Knowing what to report, and how, helps keep our schools safe.

Threats and suspicious activity can disrupt learning, create fear, and impact the entire school community. When students and families speak up early, the right team can review the information and take appropriate next steps to help keep everyone safe.



WHAT IS A THREAT?

A threat is an any statement, message, action, or behavior that suggests someone may intend to hurt another person, themselves, or a school community.



REPORT. PROTECT. KEEP TEXAS SAFE.

iWatch Texas is a statewide reporting resource provided by Texas Department of Public Safety. It allows individuals to report suspicious activity or behavior related to criminal activity or school safety.

WHAT IS SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY?

Behavior or information that seems unusual, concerning, or out of place and may indicate a potential safety concern. Examples may include:

- Someone talking about hurting another person
- A student mentioning or googling weapons
- A concerning social media post or message
- Someone asking unusual questions about the school's security
- Suspicious behavior on or around campus
- Information about a possible fight or planned unsafe activity

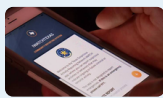
If something doesn't seem right, report it.

HOW CAN FAMILIES REPORT CONCERNS?



TELL THE SCHOOL

Contact your child's campus or a trusted staff member.



USE IWATCHTEXAS

Report suspicious activity online, by app, or by phone.



CALL 911 FOR EMERGENCIES

If there is an immediate threat to life or safety.

WHEN SHOULD I CALL 911?



A weapon is being used or displayed



Someone is actively threatening harm



Violence is happening right now

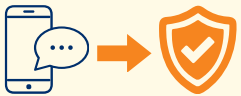


A serious medical emergency is occurring



If it is happening now and someone may be in danger, call 911 first.

SAVE IT. REPORT IT. DONT SPREAD IT.



- if you see a threatening or concerning post online, save it and report it.
- Reposting it can spread fear and make it harder to respond.

For accurate information, rely on official communication from your child's school. If information did not come from the school, it may not be accurate.

CONTINUE THE CONVERSATION AT HOME

Ask your child these questions:



- Who can you talk to at school if something concerns you?
- What would you do if a friend made a concerning statement?
- What would you do if you saw a threatening post online?

WHAT TO EXPECT THIS MONTH

SEPTEMBER DRILLS



FIRE EVACUATION

Student practice safely exiting the building and reporting to their designated locations



HOLD DRILL (MEDICAL)

Students remain in their classrooms while staff address a medical situation on campus.



SECURE DRILL

Everyone is brought inside, exterior doors are secured, and normal activities occur inside.
